What do all these activities mean?

At your own pace activities

- As Freshers will be moving in on a staggered basis, we have put together a list of
 daytime 'at your own pace activities' for you to complete during the course of the week
 depending on when you and the rest of your household move in! These activities can
 be found here. We strongly recommend that you treat this as a Freshers' Week' bucket
 list and get as many activities completed as you can!
- There are also a variety of competitions you can get involved in throughout the week.
 These have some incredible prices so we really recommend that you check them out!
 These competitions can be found here.
- Summary: can be completed as a group of up to 6, no requirement to socially distance from other members of the same household, social distancing required between members of different households (2m, 1m+ mask).

JCR Tours

- The JCR will also be running socially distanced tours of both Queens' and Cambridge. In line with the latest government guidance, tour groups will consist of 6 (5 Freshers + 1 JCR guide) and social distancing must be adhered to at all times (2m, or 1m+ precautions). Please sign up for a tour using this link! (Please only sign up to a maximum of one tour of Queens' and one tour of Cambridge to make this fair for everyone!)
- You must bring your own mask to attend.
- Summary: to be done as a group of 6 (5 freshers, 1 JCR guide), social distancing between all members is required and masks must be worn.

Activity Group Zoom - 8pm Wednesday 30th September

- Please note that your activity groups is a colour and letter combination (not just a colour) and so it contains up to 6 people.
- At 8pm on Wednesday 30th September you will have a Zoom call to meet your 'activity group' which you can join whether you have moved into college yet or not! This will be something you can arrange informally with your activity group and gives you an opportunity to discuss your DIY formal menu, plan what 'at your own pace activities' you might want to do and discuss coronavirus boundaries.
- To ensure everyone in your activity group can join, we would advise that someone in your activity group emails all group members (using their @cam email) to start a group chat and to set up the Zoom. If you haven't received an email from anyone in your activity group then why not take that first step yourself! If you use the list of activity groups you will find everyone in your group's @cam email here.

Explaining activity groups: What applies to me?

There are more than 6 people in my household.

- If there are more than 6 people in your accommodation household your household will be divided into smaller 'activity groups' for the purpose of in-person group activities during Freshers' Week in order to comply with government and college coronavirus rules. This activity group will remain set throughout the week.
- For instance, a Friars' household of 12 might be split into two groups of 6 people.
- As all members of your activity group are from the same household, there is no need to socially distance within your activity group.

There are between 4-6 people in my household.

- If there are between 4 to 6 people in your accommodation household, all the people in your household will be in your 'activity group'.
- As all members of your activity group are from the same household, there is no need to socially distance within your activity group.

There are less than 4 people in my household.

- If there are 3 or less people in your accommodation household, your activity group will be made up of two or three smaller households to make a group of up to 6 people.
- As not all members of your activity group are from the same household, social distancing will be required at all times between group members in different households.
- For example, if your activity group was made up of one household of 2 people and another household of 3 people, the pair would be required to socially distance from the trio at all times (2m, 1m+ mask).

Subject Contacts - 7pm Thursday 1st October

- On the <u>1st October</u> in the evening you will get the opportunity to meet your subject contacts! This will happen over Zoom and your subject contact will send you a link to a Zoom meeting for this. This is the perfect opportunity to ask all those subject related questions you've been dying to ask so we'd recommend having a few at the ready! If you're stuck for ideas, <u>here's a few</u> to get you going! Don't worry, even if you are yet to move into college you'll still be able to join in!

What applies to me?

Households of more than 4 people

Everyone in my activity group is from the same accommodation household.

- For those whose activity group is made up of members all from the same accommodation household, we would advise your activity group to get together in one member's room for an evening of fun!
- There is no requirement to socially distance within your household.

Households of less than 4 people

My activity group is made up of two or three accommodation households.

- For those whose activity group is made up of members from more than one
 accommodation households you will be able to meet in a room booked by the JCR in a
 socially distanced manner! We will email you to let you know where this will be nearer
 the time.
- All members of the activity group not from the same accommodation household must socially distance from one another.

Meet with assigned second year students - afternoon Saturday 3rd October (setting off at staggered times)

- You will be able to meet-up in person outdoors with your assigned second year students (weather permitting!) providing social distancing is strictly adhered to (again 2m or 1m+ mask!) It will be the responsibility of your assigned second year students to organise a meet-up on the afternoon of Saturday 3rd October. Perhaps you might want to go for a socially distanced picnic? A walk to the Botanical Gardens? The set-off times for your assigned group can be found here!
- However, if you don't feel comfortable having an in-person meet-up, a zoom meet-up is an option!
- Summary: to be done with assigned second year students, social distancing required between all those not in the same accommodation household.

JCR Workshops - 5pm Saturday 3rd/Sunday 4th October

- The JCR will be running two compulsory online workshops that must be attended during Freshers' Week. Our JCR BME Officer Seth will be running an Anti-Racism Workshop and our JCR VPE Keir along with the Welfare Officers Tamara and Alistair will be running a Welfare and Consent Workshop.
- In order to make numbers manageable, half the year group will attend one workshop on the Saturday and will then swap and attend the other workshop on the Sunday. Nearer to the time you will receive an email explaining what you need to do to access this event (which will be run using Microsoft Teams) and which workshop you will attend on each day.

Queens' Activity Group Games - daytime Sunday 4th October

- Throughout the day on <u>Sunday 4th of October</u> we will be hosting a Queens' Games' event where you will undertake tasks with your activity group, competing against other activity groups.
- During the breaks we advise you watch the videos of college officers that college will send to you.

What applies to me?

Households of more than 6 people

Everyone in my activity group is from the same accommodation household. However as my accommodation household has more than 6 people, some of the people in my household are in a different activity group.

- As everyone in your activity group is from the same accommodation household, there is no requirement to socially distance from the rest of your activity group.
- In order to comply with the rule of 6 you must socially distance from and avoid mingling
 with anyone not in your activity group (2m, or 1m+ mask). This means that <u>even</u>
 members of the same household who are in different activity groups should not interact
 or mingle during the Queens' Games.

Households of 4-6 people

Everyone in my accommodation household is in the same activity group.

- As everyone in your activity group is from the same accommodation household, there is no requirement to socially distance from the rest of your activity group.
- In order to comply with the rule of 6 you must socially distance from and avoid mingling with anyone not in your activity group (2m, or 1m+ mask).

Households of less than 4 people

My activity group is made up of two or three accommodation households.

• As not everyone in your activity group is from the same household, social distancing is required at all times within your activity group (2m or 1m+ mask). You are not required to

- socially distance from anyone in your activity group who is from your accommodation household.
- In order to comply with the rule of 6 you must also socially distance from and avoid mingling with anyone not in your activity group (2m, or 1m+ mask).

Activity Group Scavenger Hunt - morning Wednesday 7th October

What applies to me?

Everyone in my activity group is from the same accommodation household.

• There is no requirement to socially distance from those in your accommodation household.

My activity group is made up of two or three accommodation households.

 Anyone not from the same accommodation household must socially distance from one another.

Household Punting - booking required

- Are you ready to try punting? Now's your chance! We have organised 90 minute punt bookings for households.
- The JCR will have paid the fee for punting in advance, however you will as per the terms and conditions and have to comply with the deposit rules. We ask that a group leader organises their group including complying with all deposit and track/trace procedures.
 Participation is entirely optional it might not be for everyone.
- To <u>book a slot</u>, agree in your group (see the rules which apply to your group below) when is best and have a group leader fill in a slot on <u>this spreadsheet</u>. There are two slots every 10 minutes. You should prioritise any academic sessions you have. You should <u>complete this booking BEFORE the end of Sunday 4th October</u>. We'll be pleased to rearrange punting slots any time in "week 1" (8-14 October) just let us know in time! Tomos Wood (jcr-president@queens.cam.ac.uk) is the contact for this event.
- Punt hire will be from the Scudamore's boatyard, which is *upstream* of the weir opposite Silver Street to Queens'. Directions can be found here.
- You will be punting upstream, towards Grantchester (we don't think you'll make it that far), *not* along the Backs.

What applies to me?

Everyone in my activity group is from the same household.

 You can go punting as your activity group of up to 6. No social distancing is required between members of the same household.

My activity group is made up of two or three accommodation households.

If your activity group is made up of many smaller households, you will have to split up
into household groups for this event. If you are alone or in a pair of first years among
other years in a household, then you may offer that any second/third years in your
household to come with you.
